BY WAY OF EXPLANATION

It seems proper that this first number of the Law Series of The University of Missouri Bulletin should contain a few words of explanation with regard to the character of this series and the object with which it is put forth. This bulletin will appear four times a year, and during the first year it will be sent to all members of the Missouri bench and bar whose addresses can be obtained. Thereafter it will be sent only to those who signify a desire to have their names continued on the mailing list. An opportunity to signify such desire will be given at the end of the present academic year.

The bulletins of this series will contain two departments. In each bulletin will appear an article, written by a member of the faculty of the School of Law, dealing with some special phase of Missouri law. The other department will be one of notes on recent Missouri cases, which will be in charge of a board of student editors under the chairmanship of a member of the law faculty. Students will be elected in their second and third years to this editorial board by the faculty of the School of Law as a result of general excellence in their law school work.

The publication of the series is undertaken for the purpose of presenting to the members of the Missouri bench and bar the results of legal study and research, having to do with problems of Missouri law, which are carried on at the law school. It is the sincere hope of the law faculty and the board of student editors that the results of this work will prove both interesting and instructive to their readers. The editor-incharge will be very glad to receive suggestions, criticisms or comments from readers of these bulletins. He will also be glad to learn the names and addresses of lawyers of the state who are not receiving copies of the first numbers of this publication.
