been a very urgent need for one. That little breeze ruffled my for the wrong way several times before I left home - almost too much so on some occasions. Perhaps its good that I was away. Had a letter from trene tho other day. The said dot wanted to come up here, but did not want I leave mother. She did not give any particulars, nor even mention any disharmony at home, but now I suspect the reason was the same as you mentioned work is good here for women & paying 10-15 a week for experienced cooks and maids; 6 - 9 for ordinary house girls; 3.50 - 5:00 for laundering; 35 - 40¢ an hour you day work) but the town people generally, aren't a very nice bunch to live with or vist. Excusing college activity, and this base it mix with mix with town lif, there is nothing of interest here other than church
