NEWS OF THE LAW SCHOOL

The board of student editors listed on the masthead above were duly elected by the faculty at the conclusion of the spring term. Their names are published here to preserve a public record of their election, but only one man of that board was able to return this fall. New editors have been selected whose names will be published in the January issue.

The summer quarter of the law school—the first summer instruction in law offered by the University of Missouri since the last war—had a total enrollment of 48 students. The fall enrollment totaled 55, of which several have already been called. At the present time, every male student not in
