Payment for renewal subscriptions is due within thirty days of the invoice date. Any entity or individual invoiced for four or more renewal subscriptions will be charged \$5.00 per subscription for failure to pay within thirty days. Refunds will not be made for cancellations made after the publication of the first issue of any volume.

Subscribers must report non-receipt of an issue within six months of its mailing or one month of receipt of a succeeding issue, whichever is shorter, in order to receive that issue without additional charge.

All notifications of change of address should include old and new addresses, with zip code. Notice of a change of address must reach the *Review* one month in advance of publication to ensure delivery. The Post Office will not forward issues to a new address. The *Review* will forward issues missed due to address changes only upon written claim of non-receipt and prepayment of \$2.00 to cover the cost of postage and processing.
